



GOLDEN BAY HIGH SCHOOL SWIMMING MEET 2024 Friday 1st March 2024 Student & Whānau Programme



Race Rules:

- 1. No entering the pool with any form of temporary body markings.
- 2. No racing in house fancy dress.
- 3. Racing in appropriate / suitable swimwear or competition swimwear.
- 4. Official racing rules outlined by FINA may apply to top 3 finishers in finals and for relays (Session 3) and when qualified Swim NZ stroke, turn judges and referees are available. This is a school swimming event and not an official sanctioned swimming meet.
- 5. Swimmers are to start a race from a dive (deep end only) or a push off only.
- 6. Swimmers must stay in the water after their race

- until the marshall instructs them to leave.
- 7. Individual Competition events (33's, 66's and 100's) no limit on entries.
- 8. Championship winners will be calculated from their best 5 individual events. Refer to the allocation of points section below. Relay results do not count.
- 9. To encourage active participation for the full event, students who want to represent their house in a relay must participate in at least **ONE** individual event.
- 10. Each event is raced in the following order: Junior (Yr's 7 and 8), Intermediate (Yr's 9 and 10) and then senior (Yr's 11-13). Girls will swim before boys.

Organisational Information

- 1. There are 3 sessions on swimming sports day Sessions 1 and 2 are for Heats and Timed Finals, Session 3 is for Finals and Relays.
- 2. Swimmers are expected to attend sessions that they are entered in.
- 3. Swimmers are not to attend sessions that they have no races in, they must go to their normal classes.
- 4. Swimmers are expected to stay in the pool complex for the duration of the session or they must notify a member of the HPE team if they need to leave.
- 5. The whole school is expected to attend **Session 3**. Whānau will be invited.
- 6. PE department staff, Student Exec and Senior house student leaders will run the events during **Sessions 1** and 2
- 7. Teaching Staff will have roles in running the racing and supervising houses during **Session 3**
- 8. The **Staff responsibility** list will be made available by Friday 23rd Feb.
- 9. The MC will announce when swimmers are to go to marshaling during Session 3 only.
- 10. Race entries and results will be collected and stored using the ZO Sports software.
- 11. Mufti day for all students
- 12. Back-up Swimming sports day is Thursday 7th March.

Student equipment requirements for the day:

Hats - Health and Safety recommendation - wide brim that covers face and neck

Togs - Racing in appropriate / suitable swimwear or competition swimwear

T-shirt or rash vest - covering shoulders and upper arms between events

Sun Cream - There will also be school sun cream available

Drink Bottle - water refilling station will be available in the Pool area.



There will be some shelter on the poolside and it is expected that all students take responsibility to cover up and hydrate regularly. Any extra sun shade provided by parents and students would be helpful.



Kia ora koutou

Every year students are offered the opportunity to learn a musical instrument. These weekly lessons during school time are provided by a combination of a small amount of Ministry of Education funding and personal payment. There is usually a rush of interest and so waiting lists are created. Once a place is available, the student is given a time to attend their lesson. Unfortunately, once the initial excitement has worn off and daily practice is required, some students lose motivation and forget to go to their lesson.

If you want your student to have individual music tuition at school they must agree to the following conditions:

- The student will remember to come for a lesson every week at the specified time or risk losing the
 opportunity of any further lessons. NOTE: If three lessons are missed other than for sickness, the tuition
 will be offered to the next student on the list.
- The student's daily work schedule must include practice time (at least 15 minutes) on their chosen instrument.
- A \$10 instrument hire must be paid every term.
- 4. A contract is to be signed for any instrument loaned to them to take home. Each student will be responsible for the appropriate care of the instrument which may have been hired. The cost of any repairs to the instrument will be the responsibility of the student (other than general wear and tear).
- 5. Each student will remember to bring their instrument and music on the day of their music lesson.

The instrumental tuition potentially available this year is:

- Guitar
- Bass guitar
- Saxophone

- Piano
- Drums
- FluteClarinet

If you are interested in the piano, you must have a piano or keyboard at home on which to practise. Some of the other instruments are available to hire but these are limited so it would be good to ask friends and neighbours if they have a forgotten instrument you could borrow or hire.

If you have a student who wishes to be considered for instrumental tuition, please complete and sign the following form and return it to the office by **Monday 26 February.** (Forms also available at the school office).

Year 7 & 8 - We encourage athletes to enter in the family grade, (no school involvement).

To enter as part of a school year 7 & 8 team, athletes must meet the following requirements:

Have done a Rogaine or a Yellow course as a team before entry on the 31st March

All Junior teams must have their own team manager (preferably someone who knows what they are doing) Juniors are responsible for their own transport.

Gear must be brought into school the week before to be checked.

Year 9 and above

To do a 6 hour they should have previously done a 3 hour event or some equivalent (or if they haven't, this would be at coaches discretion).

Need to have experience in a map route choose either as a 3 hour Rogaine or equivalent

They need to be competent on the day to manage themselves at each transition. Adventure Racing these days are becoming more and more unsupported.

12 hour entries are at the discretion of the school and require a parent manager for each team. This is due to travel distances and wait times

You can enter a team in the 3 hr or 6 hr (open school event).

Once signed up, a non-refundable deposit needs to be paid by 31st March. We will have a parent and student meeting prior to this date for a comprehensive briefing.
