



Carlos Howard has for a second year running earned a scholarship in Physics in the NZQA scholarship examinations.

### Kia ora koutou

Every year students are offered the opportunity to learn a musical instrument. These weekly lessons during school time are provided by a combination of a small amount of Ministry of Education funding and personal payment. There is usually a rush of interest and so waiting lists are created. Once a place is available, the student is given a time to attend their lesson. Unfortunately, once the initial excitement has worn off and daily practice is required, some students lose motivation and forget to go to their lesson.

If you want your student to have individual music tuition at school they must agree to the following conditions:

- The student will remember to come for a lesson every week at the specified time or risk losing the
  opportunity of any further lessons. NOTE: If three lessons are missed other than for sickness, the tuition
  will be offered to the next student on the list.
- The student's daily work schedule must include practice time (at least 15 minutes) on their chosen instrument.
- 3. A \$10 instrument hire must be paid every term.
- 4. A contract is to be signed for any instrument loaned to them to take home. Each student will be responsible for the appropriate care of the instrument which may have been hired. The cost of any repairs to the instrument will be the responsibility of the student (other than general wear and tear).
- 5. Each student will remember to bring their instrument and music on the day of their music lesson.
