Carlos Howard Outstanding Scholarship in Physics

Carlos Howard gained an "Outstanding Scholarship" in Physics in the 2023 NZQA examination, making him one of only 24 people in NZ to achieve this last year.

Carlos first studied Level 3 Physics (upon which the Scholarship examination is based) when he was a Year 11 student, and he was first awarded a scholarship in that year.

However, Carlos' achievement in 2023 places him in a very small group of elite students.

Carlos was fortunate to have been tutored in 2022 and 2023 by Roger Nokes who moved to Golden Bay from the Engineering school at Canterbury University. Carlos expressed his gratitude to Roger for all of the time and energy that he put in.

Carlos' secret to success is to "study lots, but not too much", to always answer every question, and to practise.

Carlos is currently enrolled in a Degree in Physics at the University of Otago.




