<u>Consultation on rule change – Proposal to ban any cellphone use</u> <u>for years 7-11 from start 2024</u>

Thank you to the many whānau who have responded. It is not too late. Please see the email sent by me on 22nd August with a link to a google form. If for some reason you do not have it please

email me.

I have been asked to publish the graduated consequences. This is what we are currently thinking, though if the rule is put in place by the BoT, staff will need to work on the finer details. Whānau would have the option of collecting the phone 'earlier' themselves if confiscated.

- 1st time: warning and email home
- 2nd time: phone confiscated for 24 hours and email home
- 3rd time: phone confiscated for a week and email home
- 4th time: Whānau asked to come in, collect phone and meet with year level Dean or SLT to come up with a plan to ensure the phone is not used at school.

School Exams

Our senior students are in the middle of their school exams. We hope to have these exams marked and results back to students by the end of the term, though the timeline is very tight, as they need to be marked and then moderated.

Thank you for supporting your student. Studying is hard, and encouragement makes a difference. Years 12 & 13 had a talk from Karen Boyes recently. GOLDEN BAY HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE – NO UNIFORM

This dress code applies to all students who have permission to not wear uniform. This applies to Year 12, Year 13, on a student's birthday and designated non uniform days. Students should be practically and economically dressed in a manner that allows students and parents some choice whilst feeling comfortable and confident within themselves. The choice of clothing should be neat, clean and appropriate for both school life and everyday work.

AIMS OF GUIDELINES

To ensure safety, to prevent clothing giving offence, and to clarify expectations of appropriateness for everyday work.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. Clothing will not carry offensive messages or pictures, or slogans relating to alcohol and other drugs.
- 2. Footwear must be worn.
- 3. Clothing and jewellery must be safe for the environment in which it will be worn.
- 4. Clothing permitted:
 - a. Trousers/jeans
 - b. Shorts/skirts/dresses which cover upper legs c. Tops which:
 - i. Cover shoulders, back and chest. An example is a T-shirt
 - ii. Are tucked in or reach lower than the top of the trousers/jeans/shorts/skirt
 - iii. Cannot be seen through.

An Update from Home and School

The Home and School AGM for

2023

was held recently, and the committee decided it would be timely to update the school community on Home and School's activities for the year to date.

Home and School have continued to support the school through several initiatives in 2023. In February we were able to start the year by hosting a 'welcome BBQ' for Year 7 and 8 students and whanau. This has become an annual event and this year several members of the Board of Trustees (BOT) were also present; demonstrating the breadth of support Home and School and the BOT offer to the school community.

Home and School have continued to ensure the regular opening of the school uniform office throughout the year; made possible through the dedication and commitment of a small team of volunteers. In March we hosted 'The Plan;' a Nelson Marlborough District Health Board initiative, providing parents and caregivers with tools and ideas for managing teenage use of alcohol and vaping.

Home and School have continued to assist with 'The Solar Generation,' a project raising funds for the purchase and installation of a solar power generation system at Golden Bay High School.

We have had a large number of funding requests made in 2023. The committee have distributed funds raised to several worthy recipients.

These include:

- A significant donation to the school to fund a new lighting system in the hall to be used for school productions such as Lip Sync. The lights were also utilised for the recent Year 7 and 8 disco.
- Funding to send a student to the SISS Athletics tournament in Invercargill
- Funding to send five students to the SISS netball tournament in Invercargill

- Funding for 22 students to travel to Christchurch for a rugby tournament
- Funding for a student to travel overseas to compete in dance
- Funding for an art prize
- Funding for new caving equipment for the school caving group
- Funding to purchase replacement epi pens, supporting student health and wellness
- Contributions to school prize giving awards and the school magazine; supporting student recognition and achievement

Opportunities for Home and School to support our children's academic, cultural and sporting endeavours at Golden Bay High School are only limited by the resources within the committee. Year 10-12 Course and Subject Selection for 2024

It is time for Year 10, 11 and 12 students to plan their pathways, course and subject selection for 2024.

This is a 4 part process:

- 1. Students will be given the Senior School Course Information for 2024 booklet and Course Selection Forms on Thursday 14th September.
- 2. Thursday 14th of September 6:00-7:30pm:
 - a. NCEA Information session for Year 10 from 6:00-6:30pm: Year 10 students and whānau are invited at 6:00-6:30pm. This is a chance for whānau and students at Year 10 to find out more about how NCEA works so they are fully prepared for selecting their NCEA Level 1 subjects for 2024. A reminder that in 2024 NCEA Level 1 will be completely new. So even if you have had older members of your whānau go through NCEA before, this session could be invaluable for all whānau.
 - b. **Course Information Evening for Year 10-12 from 6:30-7:30pm in Gym Classroom:** Year 10-12 students and whānau are invited between 6:30 7:30pm to inform whānau and students of the courses available in 2024. This is an opportunity to see what is available and discuss with Heads of Courses.
- 3. Monday 18th September 9:00am-4:30pm Year 10-12 Course Selection Hui in School Hall:
 - a. There will not be any timetabled classes for Years 10, 11 and 12 on this day. Instead each student will be required to come in with a whānau member for a 20 minute hui with a member of the school academic and pastoral team.
 - b. Pre-book a 20 minute hui with one of the team to discuss pathways and assist with student decisions on subject choices for 2024. Information will be emailed nearer the time with the login details for booking this.
 - c. If possible hand in subject selection forms on that day.
- 4. Year 10-12 Course Selection Forms due Tuesday 19th September: completed and signed forms need to be handed in to the School Office by Tuesday 19th September.



Please encourage your students to get their Meningococcal vaccinations

The National Immunisation Programme wrote to you earlier in the year to inform you that the Meningococcal B (MenB) vaccine was added to the immunisation schedule, alongside the already funded Meningococcal ACWY (MenACWY) vaccine.

The meningococcal vaccines are free for young people aged 13-25 years (inclusive) who are entering into, or in their first year of residing in certain close-living situations, specifically, boarding school hostels, tertiary education halls of residence, military barracks, prison, or youth justice facilities.

There is also a free 'catch up' programme (for MenB only) available for the same eligible age group who are in <u>any year</u> of the above close-living situations. The catchup period runs until 28 February 2024. After this, only those entering into, or in their first year living in these facilities will be eligible to receive the vaccine for free.

How you can support:

- Actively encourage young people to have their free MenB vaccination as soon as possible (i.e., before moving into your facility) to reduce their risk of the harm caused by meningococcal disease.
- Use this opportunity to encourage whanau to catch-up on any immunisations they
 have missed, including MenACWY, which is funded for this same age group in their
 first year of close-living situations. Measles and human papilloma virus (HPV)
 vaccines can also be given at the same time as MenB.
- Facilitate vaccination services at your facility as appropriate. Your local Health District Immunisation Lead can help with this.
- Use and share the range of resources and key messages attached with this letter.
