Cyber Safety with John Parsons

Mohua Social Services and the local schools have collaborated to bring speaker John Parsons to Golden Bay in late October. John Parsons is an Internet Safety and Risk Assessment Consultant working with schools, the private sector and the health sector, providing specialist advice and direction on the safe and ethical use of Digital Communication Technologies.

My 2025 Rugby Season – A Year to Remember

This past year has been one of the most rewarding in my rugby journey so far. Over the past five years, I've played on and off for the Motueka Girls U18 Rugby team, and last year I had the opportunity to play with Stoke. I first started playing when I was just 12 years old, not long after I arrived in the Bay. The rules have changed since then, and players that young can't join anymore, so I feel really fortunate to have had that early start to grow and learn the game.

One of the biggest highlights this year was being selected for the U18 Wahine Mako squad for the second year in a row. I was chosen from a group of around 60 girls to be part of the final 26-player travelling team, which was such an honour.

We competed in the South Island Development Rugby Competition in Timaru during the school holidays and came away with 3rd place. The competition was tough, but it was an awesome experience to represent my region alongside such a strong group of players.

I've played almost every position on the field over the years, and I really enjoy the variety that brings, but Flanker is definitely my favourite spot. I love the physicality, the speed, and the chance to always be in the middle of the action. This season, I was so proud to be named MVP for Motueka High School's U18 team—it is a trophy not generally offered to a student outside of Motueka High School.

The U18 Grade is played on a Wednesday night in the winter season which means I travel over



the hill up to four times a week during our extended season. Playing games as far as Blenheim means early finish from school and really late home.

This year, our Motueka High team made it to the final, and we won the U18 Competition in a close and hard-fought game against Waimea at Riwaka. That win meant so much to all of us, and it was the perfect way to end the season.

I'm so grateful for the opportunity to play rugby through school and for all the support we've had from Motueka High. It's been an amazing journey so far, and I'm excited to see where rugby takes me next.

Meningitis is on the rise again in New Zealand.

The vaccine is free of charge to students entering Halls of Residence, or armed forces next year, and also to any students who turn 13 years of age while living in boarding school hostels.

Meningitis strains covered are A,B,C,W &Y, 2 vaccines at first visit followed by a booster 8 weeks later.

Ideally you would want to start mid-end November in order to get the booster dose before moving to new living situation.

Australian Orienteering Championships

In the school holidays, I travelled to Brisbane, Australia, for the Australian Orienteering Championships as well as the Schools Championships held over 9 very hot days.

It did not start well with a cancelled flight and rental car, so I missed the warm-up event. I also had a bad cold, which seemed to be typical for me when travelling to Australia.

First up was the Australian Sprint Race around the Brisbane University. It had plenty of challenges, but I was struggling to breathe, so I had to settle for 6th place.

The next day was a 6km long distance in 30+ degree heat. I was having a great run, but then I felt really cold, had goose bumps, and wanted to vomit. I sat down for a few minutes, but still felt awful. I was so close to walking off the course, but I decided to walk the last 6 controls to finish my course. Turns out I was only 14 seconds off a medal and placed 4th. I suffered heat exhaustion and was in a bad way for several hours.



Monday was a rest day. The next 3 days were the School events, a Sprint, a Long and a Relay. I did manage to pick up another bug, probably Influenza A, as 2 of my friends had it. This did not help my ability to compete or breathe or think straight, but I wasn't prepared to sit it out and stubbornly continued to compete.

They brought all the starts forward 90 minutes to avoid the worst of the heat, but that meant for early starts every day. Despite not making mistakes, I was in no shape to compete with the top level, although I did run the fastest time for my relay variation, gaining 2

places, but it wasn't enough to pull my team up into the medals.



Saturday was the Australian relay champs, and my team were the sickies; all 3 of us had been sick.

To make it more challenging, the relay started at 5:30 pm, so the first runner was in daylight, the second leg runner had twilight and a bit of darkness, and the third leg runner (me) ran in complete darkness. (Brisbane doesn't do daylight savings, so it's light at 5:30am and dark by 6:30pm).

My first runner had a great race but my second runner didn't fare so well in the darkness so I only started a few minutes before the mass start (for runners whose team members hadn't returned in time).



I'd never competed in an orienteering event in the dark, so it was a completely new experience, not one that I liked very much when I couldn't find my second control.

Thankfully back on track, and I caught up a few places and about 10 minutes on other competitors.

We came 5th in Women's 20 Elite grade. There were so many cane toads on the course that I had to dodge them as I didn't want to stand on them, but they did look kinda cool.

Sunday was our last event, my favourite, the Middle Distance.

Still wasn't feeling great as it was a late night back from the relay and a 5 am start, so no real rest, so I dosed myself up on painkillers and headed out.

With a 2km walk to the event centre and another 1.5km to the start, it felt like I'd already raced.

The terrain was hilly, covered in bush with lots of large rocks (a bit like Castle Rock in Canterbury, but in the forest).

I had a clean run and was surprised to see that I had 3 minutes on my next competitor when I finished.

I then had to wait an agonising 30 minutes to see the rest of my grade finish as we all had staggered start times. I held my position and took out the gold medal for the W18 grade.

Big thanks to mum, who was my Uber driver and number 1 supporter in Australia. She also competed but struggled with the heat as well.

We travelled to Richmond twice a week for practices and then again in the weekends, sometimes traveling as far as Timaru for games. We ended up coming 3rd overall in our competition. In Term Two I was selected to play as lock for the Nelson Bays U16 rep team.

For three months, we prepared and played games against Buller, West Coast, and Marlborough before



heading to a tournament in Christchurch over the September holidays. We went to the tournament undefeated, having secured a good win against the main rivals, Marlborough.

Three games in three days was tough, yet rewarding. The first game was an easy win to start against South Canterbury.

Day two was a tough win against Canterbury Metro Red, whereby we kicked a conversion to win, right on full-time. This crucial win meant we were in the final.

The day of the final arrived and we pulled together three months of training.

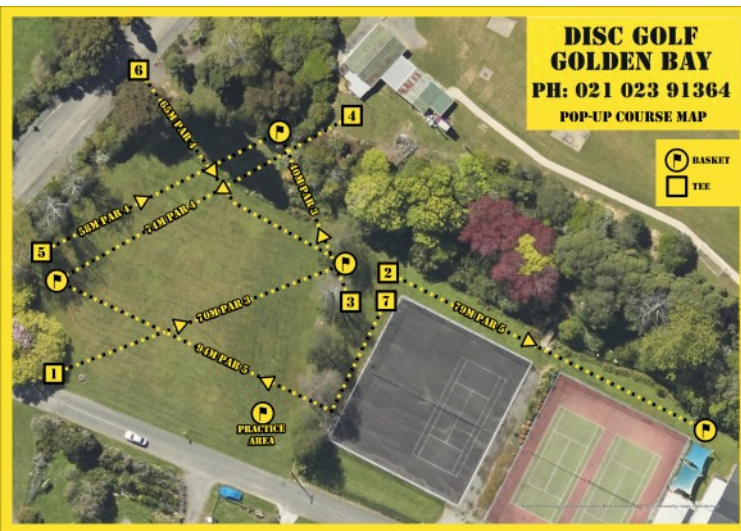
In this game everything clicked and we managed to win 46-45 against Canterbury Metro Black.

This was a tense and close game, but we managed to hold on to the lead in the final minutes, despite a determined effort from the opposition to score.

We were obviously very pleased to take the win, especially as we were the first Nelson Bays Under 16 team to do so in 15 years, and only the third ever Nelson Bays Under 16 team to win the shield (South Island Under 16 Rugby Championship shield) in the 55 years the shield has been contested.
